We reject defendant's argument that defendant's increased sentencing exposure based on the trial court's finding that defendant had been convicted of a prior felony drug offense violated the Sixth Amendment. Alleyne v. United States, 133 S.Ct. 2151, 2160 n. 1 (2013) (declining to revisit Almendarez-Torres); United States v. Carrigan, --- F.3d ---, 2013 WL 3778723, *9 n.4 (1st Cir. July 19, 2013). But we agree that since the jury did not find a specific cocaine quantity above 500 grams, defendant's sentence must be vacated and the case remanded for further proceedings consistent with the Supreme Court's intervening decision in Alleyne v. United States, 133 S. Ct. 2151 (2013). The government's unobjected to motion to remand is granted.

Vacated and remanded.
